

**City Council Building
Chattanooga, Tennessee
December 19, 2000**

The meeting of the Chattanooga City Council was called to order by Chairman Hakeem, with Councilmen Crockett, Eaves, Franklin, Hurley, Lively, Pierce, Rutherford, and Taylor present. City Attorney Mike McMahan, Management Analyst Randy Burns, and Shirley Crownover, Assistant Clerk to the Council, were also present.

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/
INVOCATION**

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Attorney McMahan gave the invocation.

MINUTE APPROVAL

On motion of Councilman Lively, seconded by Councilman Franklin, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as published and signed in open meeting.

EXPRESSION OF SYMPATHY

At this point Chairman Hakeem stated that we make an effort to be a family to one another; that one of us has lost a father—Mr. Barry Bennett—and he expressed the Council's sympathy to Mr. Bennett at this trying time.

**SPECIAL PRESENTATION:
JOHN GROSS**

Chairman Hakeem turned this presentation over to Chief Coppinger who bid the Council a good evening and thanked them for allowing him to make this presentation to a firefighter for a job well done. He stated that members of the Fire Department thought that this was extremely important and the recognition was deserved and that this man needed to be recognized for his bravery. The firefighter's name is **John Gross**, and the purpose of this presentation is to honor him for an act of bravery that happened on October 10, 1974. Chief Coppinger stated that John Gross was now a veteran in the fire department with 25 years and in 1974 held the responsibility as a firefighter and EMT in

an accident that occurred at the Ridge Cut where there was a vehicular accident where Firefighter Gross was administering care to a victim. A tractor trailer rig lost control

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at the location of the accident where Firefighter Gross was attending two victims. He saw that the victim was in real danger and got to his feet and grabbed one of the victims from “harm’s way”; the tractor trailer knocked the car into Firefighter Gross and into the victim, and Firefighter Gross was able to save the individual’s life; they both required hospital treatment, and as a result, Firefighter Gross was awarded a very prestigious award, “ *The Carnegie Award*”. He is the only recipient ever in our Fire Department, and Chief Coppinger stated that they were proud they could recognize him tonight for his bravery and the recognition he had brought to the department. He noted that Firefighter Gross was a humble individual who did not want recognition and this award went unnoticed by the City Fathers at the time it happened. He stated that they now thought that it was important to do this right—that there had been no other recipient of this award.

Chairman Hakeem stated that on behalf of the Mayor and his colleagues on the City Council, that he would like to express appreciation to Firefighter Gross; that it was long time coming, and that we truly appreciate the job that he has done; that in the future we will try to do things of this nature in a more proper way and stated that Firefighter Gross was a role model for all to follow.

Firefighter Gross expressed his appreciation for this recognition and also his appreciation for Chief Coppinger and his staff for taking time to come down for this presentation. He noted that he had a young son who was present tonight who was not yet born at the time this occurred and this was a great honor for him to be a part of and makes it that much more special.

Councilman Franklin stated that he and Councilwoman Hurley were just talking and that they believed that Gene Roberts was Fire and Police Commissioner at that time and that his father (Commissioner John Franklin) was on the City Commission at that time. He thanked Firefighter Gross for his years of service.

Chairman Hakeem also thanked all of the firefighters for the fine work that they do every day, stating that we appreciate all they do.

JACK MARCELLIS

As Adm. Marcellis approached the podium to present his Departmental Report, Chairman Hakeem asked Nancy Marcellis, his wife, to join him. Chairman Hakeem thanked Adm. Marcellis, who is retiring as of 12/31/00, for ten years of great support for Public Works programs and proposals. He stated that it had been a wonderful and rewarding ten years. He asked Mrs. Marcellis to make a few remarks.

Mrs. Marcellis stated that Jack had enjoyed every moment of it and would enjoy “playing” now. Adm. Marcellis added that his wife always said that he could “play” as hard as he “works”. At this time Adm. Marcellis introduced his eldest son to the Council, who stated that it was great to be here and noted that the Council Assembly Room looked even better in reality.

Councilwoman Hurley stated that she arrived at Jack’s party late and had had no opportunity to speak on Jack’s behalf. She stated what Jack had meant to her was hard to put into words; that he ran his department exceptionally well, a department that was one of the most complex entities in the City. She stated that what was special about Jack was his willingness to talk to the Council members’ constituents; that he did this in the most patient and responsive way of any individual she had ever known.

Councilman Eaves quipped that Jack was a “dirty, rotten coward”; that he had done a great job, and he hated to see him go, but being the “coward” that he was, he was leaving us. He urged that Adm. Marcellis come back from time to time.

Chairman Hakeem thanked Adm. Marcellis for ten years, and he also thanked his wife, stating that the Council had kept Jack down here many hours after 4:30 P.M., and it took a real partner to work through this. He asked that the Marcellis’ play hard, noting that they were a couple we all should admire, and he thanked them.

Councilman Pierce asked Jack if he and Nancy knew where they were going on a cruise. Adm. Marcellis responded “not yet”. Councilman Pierce stated that it was Nancy’s priority to choose where she wanted to go. Mrs. Marcellis indicated her appreciation of this.

Councilman Crockett stated that Jack Marcellis was one of the first people he worked with 25 years ago and had spent many hours working with neighborhood associations. He stated that he echoed Councilwoman Hurley’s remarks; that he did not know anyone more “unflappable” than Jack; that he always smiled and went on, and he might have a secret for this named “Nancy”. He added that Adm. Marcellis did not look much different than he did 25 years ago; that he had done a remarkable job.

Adm. Marcellis responded that his wife had kept him young and healthy. (Councilwoman Hurley added that men who lose their hair early are attractive to women and always look the same!)
